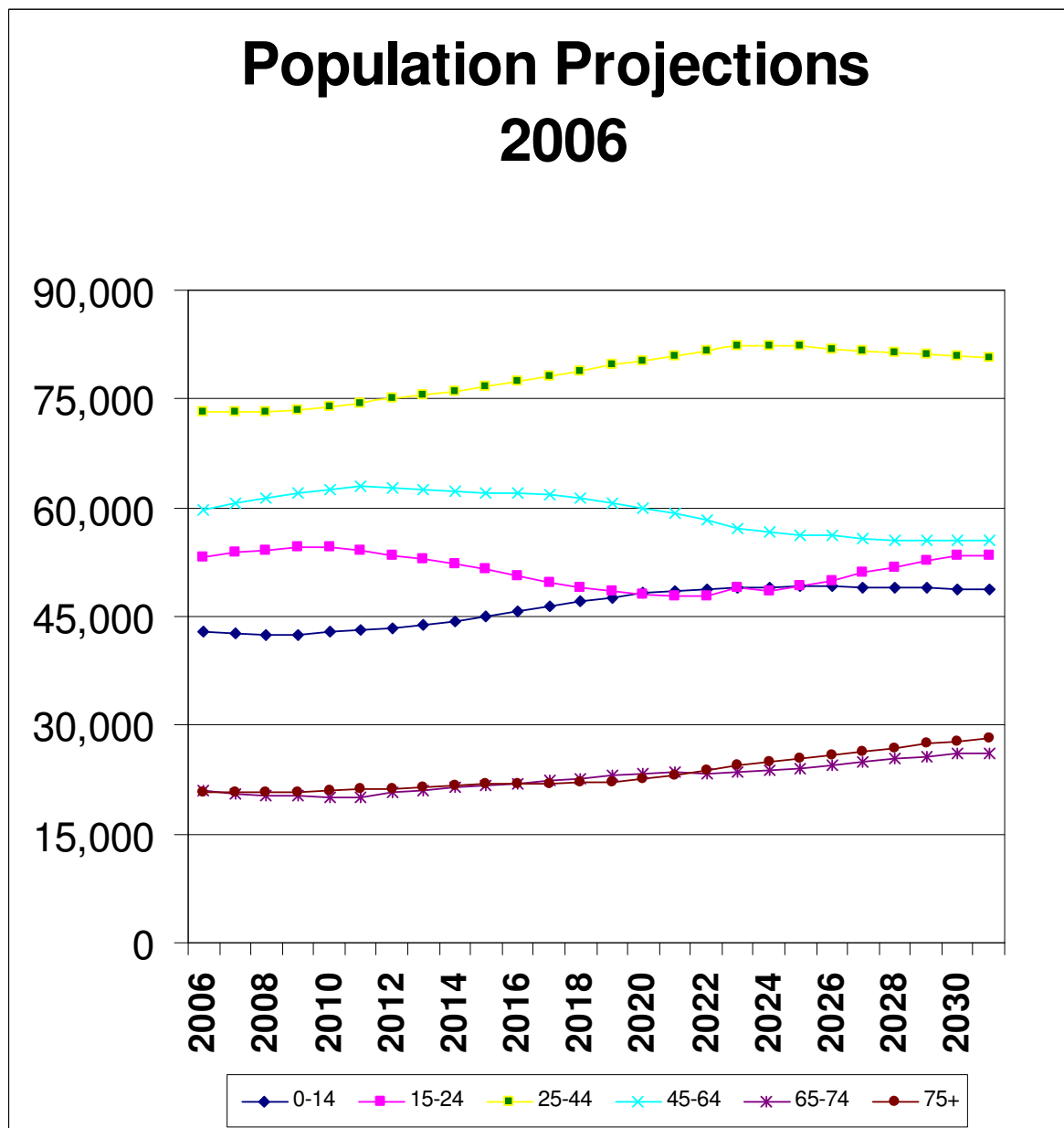
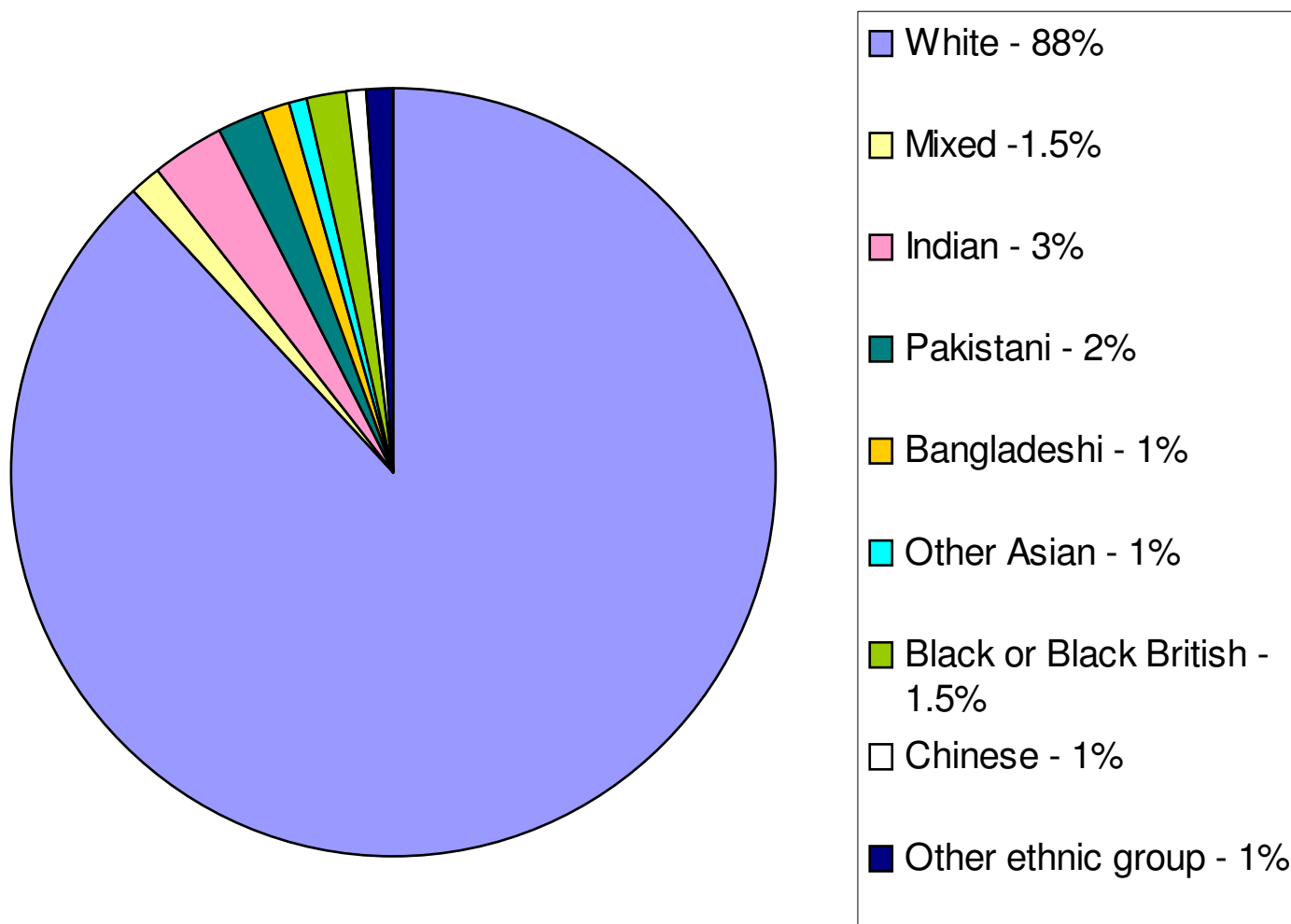


# Ages of people in Newcastle



- 15-24 age group shows a downward projection up to 2020 and then increases from 2025 onwards
- 65+ age groups shows a steady projected increase, and a greater increase from 2020-21 onwards, in particular for over 75 year olds

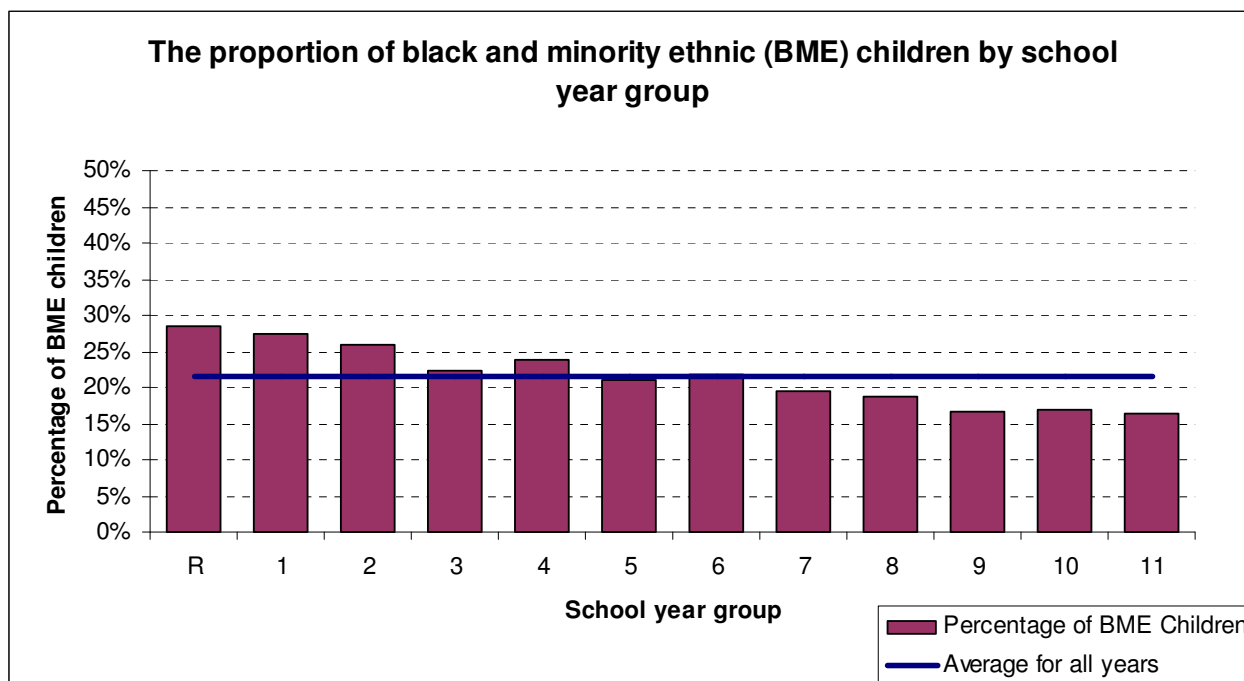
# Ethnicity of people in Newcastle



• 88% of Newcastle's population is white and 12% comprises other ethnic groups

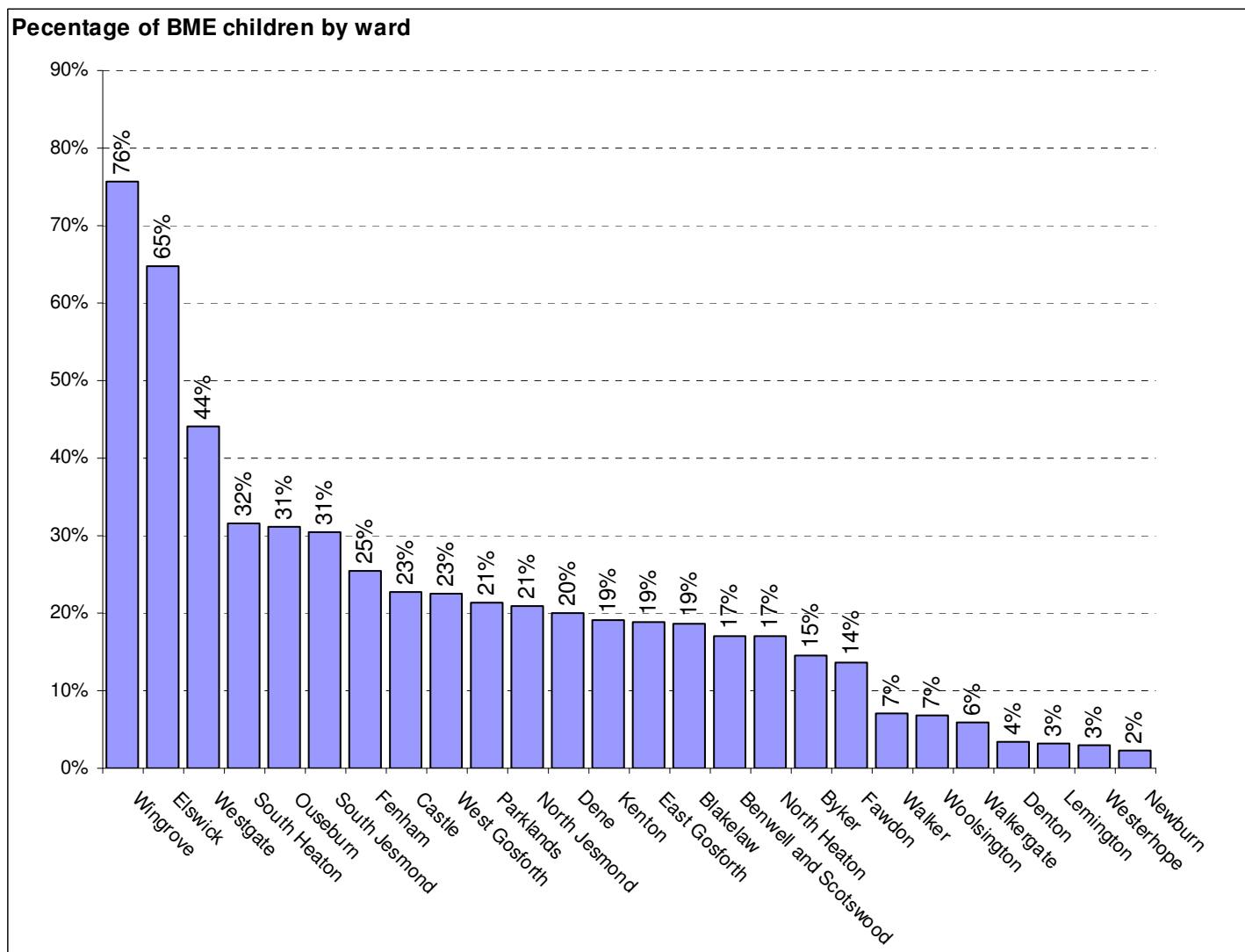
• The main minority ethnic groups in Newcastle are Indian and Pakistani

# The ethnicity of the school population (aged 5-16)



- The proportion of black and minority ethnic children is much higher in primary schools than in secondaries and the proportion in reception classes continues to rise with each annual intake
- In 2007 the average across all year groups was 16%. In 2011 it had risen to 22%. If the recent trend continues, the proportion across all year groups could rise to 25% by 2015
- We anticipate the growing diversity to be reflected in the wider city population as these children become adults

# The ethnicity of the school population (aged 5-16)



- The wards with the highest proportion of resident children from BME backgrounds are in the inner west area of the city, whereas those on the eastern and western boundaries show lower proportions
